

## HOW TO CALCULATE YOUR SCORE

### Section I: Multiple Choice

$$\left[ \frac{\text{Number Correct (out of 80)}}{\text{Number Wrong}} - \frac{1}{4} \times \text{Number Wrong} \right] \times 1.125 = \text{Weighted Section I Score (Do not round.)}$$

### Section II: Free Response

$$\begin{aligned} &4.50 \times \text{Question 1 (0-9 points)} = \text{Question 1 Weighted Score} \\ &2.750 \times \text{Question 2 (0-9 points)} = \text{Question 2 Weighted Score} \\ &2.750 \times \text{Question 3 (0-9 points)} = \text{Question 3 Weighted Score} \\ &\text{Question 1 Weighted Score} + \text{Question 2 Weighted Score} + \text{Question 3 Weighted Score} = \text{Weighted Section II Score (Do not round.)} \end{aligned}$$

### Composite Score

$$\text{Weighted Section I Score} + \text{Weighted Section II Score} = \text{Composite Score (Round to the nearest whole number.)}$$

Composite Score*	AP Grade	Interpretation
114-180	5	extremely well qualified
91-113	4	well qualified
70-94	3	qualified
49-73	2	possibly qualified
0-48	1	no recommendation

\*Each year the Development Committee determines the formulas used to calculate the raw composite scores. The Chief Faculty Consultant determines how the composite scores fit into the 5-point AP scale.
