

## Standard Test Review

These methods of study help prepare for any study-guide-based test with a multiple choice plus in-class essay format.

Using the study guide, organize the information contained in the study guides.

### Categories

First, what categories of information do you see? Of course you will find the obvious ones: economic, political, social. What others can you come up with? Once you have several categories listed, list all the events, people, and other terms that fall within that category.

### Essential Questions

Be sure that you can write a clear, arguable, and provable thesis for each of the essential questions that are on the study guides. Then list the events, people, and other terms that you could use to prove each of your thesis statements. Remember: the essay question will require you to use information from both study guides.

### Cause and Effect

For each of the events on the study guide, be sure that you can identify causes and effects. Make a chart and fill it in:

Cause	Event	Effect/Significance

Note: In general, any terms and ideas that are in the assigned reading sections but that we did not cover in class WILL be on the tests. You will be expected to know what the book says about them.
